Field training programs

1. "Resilience building on a local-scale by a Hokkaido City: Hakodate as a case study" (mid-August in Hakodate).
2. "Resilience building through sturgeon aquaculture and tourism" (early September in Bifuka Town, Northern Hokkaido).

Open to any undergraduate or graduate student, these two courses introduce students to key issues currently facing regional cities and towns in Japan. Through lectures, site visits, group work and fact-finding activities, and by drawing upon their own experiences and knowledge, participants devise and present action plans suggesting how Hakodate and Bifuka can become more resilient communities.
